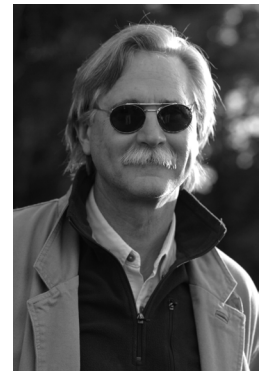

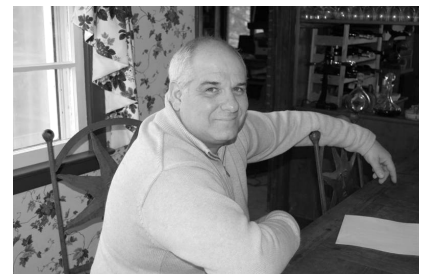


PANELISTS:
